Returned category is the percentage of transfers in a given fall term who returned to the institution in the subsequent fall term. For example, the 2nd-Yr returned percentage for the fall 1996 transfers is the percentage of fall 1996 transfers who returned for the fall term, 1997.

Graduated Percentage is the cumulative percentage of transfers in a given fall term who had graduated by the end of the summer in the given year. For example, the 4th-Yr graduation percentage for fall 1996 transfers is the percentage of fall 1996 transfers who graduated from the institution by the end of the summer of 2000.
